From Our Pastor's Desk:

Dear Ones,

We worship a gracious and loving God. The Lord is mighty and while it seems impossible to imagine, God never leaves us behind when the chips are down. And far too often, the chips feel like they are down! We think to ourselves "I'll pray about it, sure, but, why me, Lord? I am unworthy; you must have more important things to do than to listen to me and my stuff! How could you ever pay attention to me, hear my prayers, or speak any of your truth for me to follow — I am simply a person".

Scripture is filled with prophets who thought the same and yet God spoke. We do not have records of what certain prophets prayed just before God spoke, but God spoke! Remember Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel? Isaiah was called by angels with burning coals to his lips and God asked, "whom shall I send?". Jeremiah who was only a child and told God knew him as he was in the womb; God will give him the words needed. Or Ezekiel who was in the midst of despair with his people in the captivity of Babylon when called to see God in person, in the field, to be told he was needed to speak for God. These were regular folks, faithful in life but not high priests or rulers of the land. God needed God's people to share God's message of hope, faith, and love. And we read they were grateful.

God speaks, we listen. And we too, can be grateful to be pulled from despair, a life of little purpose, or a life that needs a bit of courage.

It is the month where we highlight gratefulness, and giving thanks. I am grateful for as many moments in my humble life as you are; so I am asking that we share them. Let's remember some of the good stuff! What right now, are you grateful for in this life we share in our faith community? Is there a comfort you enjoy? Are there people for whom you are so grateful you

cannot imagine a life they are not or were not a part of? Is there a job you are grateful is over because it was not a place you were thrilled to be? What service to the Lord are you grateful to be able to provide as you give God the glory? What does God's love mean to you?

To share some of this, I am inviting us to make a banner for the church that speaks to our gratitude to the Lord in our faith, and we can play with it week by week during November. I will bring the supplies (paint, brushes and long banner fabric), you bring the ideas of how you want to speak to the gratefulness you have for the Lord for what God's love means to you. I know I am grateful for you and as a result, I give thanks to God for this body of Christ. I am also grateful for the source of love in my life that Jesus has shown me is possible beyond my expectations. It brings a sense of peace, or as many say, "a way where there was no way"!

I also ask you to bear in mind: To be grateful is a blessing, because it means you have been touched, anointed by the Holy One, and put on a path that is shimmering with light and love. Remember: 1 Thessalonians "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."


"Experiencing God", by Henry

Red Bird Mission is a United Methodist mission site in the South east corner of Kentucky. The mission's programs include a K-12 Christian school, senior center, test kitchens, education for new mothers, no to low-cost access to clothing, food, health care, dental care, home repair, & more. The poverty rate in the area, Clay County, ranks it as one of the poorest counties in the United States. 35.4% of families & 39.7% of the population live below the poverty line, including 47.6% of those under the age of 18 and 31.3% of those age 65 or over. For comparison, in Ontario County 4.90% of families & 7.30% of the population live below the poverty line, including 9.1% of those under age 18 & 6.4% of those age 65 or over.

Favorite Church Recipes

3-Bean Salad

- 1 16 oz can corn
- 1 16 oz can wax beans
- 1 16 oz can green beans
- 1 16 oz can gorgonzola beans
- 1 large red pepper, chopped
- 1 large green pepper, chopped1 large green pepper
- 3 small onions, thinly sliced

Marinade

1 ½ cup sugar

1/3 cup oil

1 2/3 cup vinegar

1 tsp salt

½ tsp pepper

1 garlic clove

Drain and rinse vegetables well.
In a large bowl, mix all vegetables well
In a small pan, mix all marinade ingredients
& heat to dissolve sugar
Pour warm marinade over vegetables

Chocolate Sauce- Albert Hatch & Charlotte Davis

Blend 1 cup sugar, 1/3 cup cocoa, 2 Tbsp flour & add 1 cup boiling water & 1 Tbsp butter. Stir well, cook over low heat til slightly think (stir constantly so does not burn). Remove from heat & add ½ tsp vanilla.

End of year budget thoughts to share from Pastor Robin....

Each year IUMC's administrative council looks at the financial costs of keeping the ministry running. We call it, a budget! Like any not-for-profit, we have some fixed expenses that need attention each month. We also have long terms goals and dreams that require attention and plenty of discussion. All of this is bathed in prayer both while we are all together and when we are at home in prayer about the faith community in which we gather for spiritual growth, strength, service, and worship. That is part of the leadership we all share. I know you pray for the church, too.

We offer a narrative budget in addition to the columns and numbers that total something at the bottom of the page. It will be written out for you in the near future, but for now, think of it this way:

- our Pastor's ¼ time salary and reimbursable expenses are the single largest line items in our budget. This allows us to have a pastor with experience and an education that keeps her learning and growing to lead us in our spiritual journey as a community of faith. Pastor has a certain number of Sunday's out of the pulpit each year and we reimburse substitutes, or, some of our members lead us in worship who donate their time.
- We pay our organist/pianist for the worship experience because we love having live music in our worship service! We have been blessed with Barb Bennett and Sue Belcher this past year!
- We like the sanctuary and fellowship hall clean when we arrive, so we pay Linda Miller to make sure we honor the Lord with a clean "house"!
- We have electricity and fuel bills even if we don't use the church daily, we like it warm this time of year – amen?
- And praise God for volunteer trustees who fix things that breakdown, or call the appropriate experts to fix things that breakdown. We keep going in our well-maintained building!
- Even with the enormous amount of volunteer services from the congregation, there are expenses for the fundraisers through the year and we meet those expenses while gathering for God's good purposes in fellowship, sharing, and feeding one another!
- Our mission purposes have deep meaning for us all. That we could purchase an entire Ark for Heifer International to distribute this year was awesome. Some of the other contributions we make for Jesus to be served include resisting matters of injustice and where needs arise:

- Blessing Room (food, school supplies) and Holiday Baskets
- Safe Harbors of the Finger Lakes (spiritual care and ending violence)
- Rochester Refugee Resettlement Center (welcoming new Citizens)
- UMCOR (and the 6 Special Sundays in the UMC, where needs arise globally)
- Red Bird Mission (a missional Annual Conference in our connection)
- Rochester Open Door Mission for the Homeless and Mitten Tree (homelessness hurts)
- Family Promise of Ontario County (homeless families are helped)
- And others..... we give where we can in the name of the Christ!

I also know you give for the church in the name of Christ to other groups, other missions, other ways to love and it all matters! I praise God for you!

As we visit the end of the fiscal year as well as a budget for the new year, I pray you will follow the wisdom of John Wesley who said: "Earn all you can, save all you can, give all you can."

We run on the prayers of your hearts; we have the faith to do God's work (whose hand and hearts but ours?) as a community of believers that must serve the Lord to honor God. As we glorify God we find we can delight in the sheer generosity of financial contribution that as we give we can not only "keep the lights on", but be here for the community that has needs. We serve God together for the peace of Christ in the world, and God willing, we will invite people to a relationship with Jesus Christ. This Jesus, whose grace in this life offers a freedom from sin that allows our hearts and minds to be open to all God reveals to us, is everything. We are forever learning to love God better, and because you give your time and talents, we are able to keep faithfully seeking God's will in our faith community of Ionia

John 3:16 "For God so loved the world... He gave his only son...." What shall we give in return?

Thank you for the financial contributions you make to the church. Let's keep it going, together, in the name of Christ and for HIS sake! Amen and praise be to God!
