From Our Pastor's Desk:

"Praise be to the God and our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead." 1Peter 1:3

We waved our Palms for a parade. We greeted the young man on a donkey, gently and humbly coming into town. He smiled at the children and all of us, moved we were there to greet him. We were caught up in the excitement because the rumor was he was the long-awaited Messiah! We shouted, risking safety in the community of Roman governance as we cried, "Hosanna!", which translates to, "save us"! He took us to a supper and talked about bread and wine as his body and blood and every time we eat and drink, to remember him.

We followed him to the garden at night where he prayed and was arrested. We watched silently as Pilate condemned him to death and too many in the crowd were not shouting "save us", but crucify him. It was awful. Then, he died on the cross and our hearts were broken, because even if he was not the Messiah – he was a really gentle soul and he helped many people. He did not deserve to die like that; it was awful.

When the tomb was empty just after the Sabbath, everyone was confused! It was thought someone stole his body – it turned out, he actually rose from that tomb. He was not in there because he was not dead! Was it some sort of magic trick? Was it someone making a fool of the faithful who held onto prayers and hope? No. it was real – Jesus lived. There was no death in Jesus! He had told us he was the fulfilment of scripture. He had told us he and God were one. He had told us he loved us no matter what and that he could forgive our sins forever: it was hard to hear and harder to understand. But now, to see him live beyond human death our faith was deepening to bring a new acceptance in our community. We could not

understand, but we could not deny what we saw and felt as he walked by and smiled.

He walked and talked and ate with his friends. He told them to tell everyone about him. He said tell them all that love could offer through the grace of his sacrifice: we could not go back to life as it was before. We just couldn't. There was joy and hope we had never felt! It was an energy and we had to talk about it! Some folks starting wandering to tell others the story, some folks stayed in Jerusalem to help people there understand what this was because it was a miracle. A real miracle. God is real and we were told everyone matters. Not just the Romans or the wealthy, but regular folks, too. Everyone matters to God and to life in the present. We invited everyone to believe.....we could not stop talking about, Jesus.

Today, we still stand in awe of the story and the empty tomb. And we are asked only one question: Do you believe in the God of the cosmos that no tomb or earthly death could hold? If you do, how have you given your life as a living sacrifice to God in response to His amazing grace? If you have not fully embraced the truth of Jesus sacrifice, love, and grace perhaps now is the time. If you believe, now is the time.

In our loving congregation we find we can hear God calling us to tell everybody, too. All people matter to the Lord. All of us are forgiven our sins. All of us can humble down and remember the story that tells us who and why God is the great, "I AM". God is the One whose creative spirit brought forth all there is within our sight, sound, touch, smell, and feeling.

With spring it is the birdsong and daffodils that remind me of "How Great Thou Art". When we gather for worship or events or a visit, I am reminded of the blessing of community in faith where the sacred is noticed and resides. When babies cry in church, I know the blessings and miracles of God are everlasting and when my

time is done on this earthly realm, I will be assured that with babies in our midst the presence of love resides. And if you know love, you know God (Jn. 4:17)

We will continue loving God with creation care for the full season of Easter which takes us to Pentecost Sunday. Keep recycling, reducing consumption of plastics, and reusing all you can so we can treat God's creation like it matters, too.

<u>Favorite Church Recipes</u> Ravioli Lasagna - Roger Cullen

Heat oven to 375 F

Sauté 2 teaspoons olive oil 1 medium onion, finely chopped.

When onions are just translucent add: 1 lb lean ground sirloin & ½ pound ground Italian sausage

When meat is fully cooked: Add 28oz jar of pasta sauce 1t dried basil, 1/4c chopped olives or tapenade, 1/4c marinated artichoke rough chopped, Pinch of ground red pepper, Salt and pepper to taste

While sauce simmers prepare: 1 egg whisked into 1c ricotta cheese, 1/4t ground nutmeg

Collect layering ingredients: 20oz frozen spinach ravioli, 3c shredded mozzarella cheese, 1/2c shredded Parmesan cheese, 1/4c seasoned panko crumbs

Layer everything in oiled 9x13 pan: Thin layer sauce, 1/2 of Ravioli, ½ of sauce, ½ of ricotta, ⅓ of mozzarella, 1/2 of Ravioli, 1/3 of sauce, 1/2 of Ricotta, Parmesan cheese. Remaining mozzarella, Top with panko

Bake 30 minutes

Cool at least 10 minutes before cutting to allow layers to set


